



A Greater Glory

Haggai 2:1-9

- Remind each other of the historical context, where does Haggai come in the story of the Old Testament? This can be vital for our understanding!
- Consider verse 3, how might this be a humbling question? Why might it be important for them to realise that the temple they're building isn't as glorious as Solomon's temple?
 - What is encouraging or challenging from verses 4 and 5?
 - What are they being shown in verses 6 and 7?
 - This passage is referred to in Hebrews 12:25-29... it might be useful to read around some of Hebrews 12-13 to consider how the author applies this idea to New Testament believers.
- We often jump straight to individual, personal application of passages, but in Haggai he's very clearly addressing the whole people together (see verses 1-2), does it make a difference to our understanding and applications when we read passages like these as addressing the whole church together?
