

Hebrews 7:1-28 : Mel-who?

- 1. How do you feel when you come across "chewy" bits of scripture like this? What helps you engage with it instead of skipping past?
- 2. Look back at Genesis 14, in what ways does Melchizedek resemble Jesus?
- 3. Read Psalm 110, how does this Psalm look Christ-like? (you could also have a look at how Jesus quotes it in Matthew 22:41-46)
- 4. Read over Hebrews 7:1-10, how would you summarise the point it's making?
- 5. Hebrews 7:11-28 shows how Jesus fits the role of a priest in the order of Melchizedek, read over it- what strikes you particularly from this section?
- 6. Remembering the context of the letter to the Hebrews, why is this message particularly important for them to hear and understand?
- 7. We have different issues to the original audience! Thinking about your day to day life and challenges, how do verses 22-28 encourage or challenge you?

Thoughts for junior church

This is a difficult passage! You may want to just take one or two ideas from it to emphasise with your groups... some thoughts:

- Could try a game along the lines of "good" vs "best"
 - What would make a good dog / car / pudding / teacher/ acrobat
 - What would make the best...
 - The Hebrews had priests, who were trying to do a good job... but Jesus is the best priest.
- What is the job of a priest? To teach the people and to make sacrifices to help them say sorry to God.
- Right back at the beginning of the bible God showed us what kind of priest we would need: look at the story of Melchizedek in Genesis 14
- What makes Jesus the best priest? Heb 7:17-28... you might just want to focus on the quote from Psalm 110 in verse 21.
