

John 2v12-25: Worship at the True Temple

In *John 2v12–25 this Sunday*, we saw Jesus clearing the temple, confronting a system that had become more about profit than prayer. This powerful act reveals not only his righteous anger at false worship but also signals the arrival of a new temple—Jesus himself. The old system of sacrifices had a shelf life, but now, through Christ, imperfect people can be made friends with a perfectly holy God. He is the new place where we meet God, the true Passover Lamb who offers full and final forgiveness through his death and resurrection.

Application

- 1. As you reflect on the Bible's big storyline, (starting from Genesis and working forwards) what key examples can you name of God's commitment to restoring relationship with his people?
- 2. Why was Jesus so angry? What examples can you come up with where people might be mixing faith with something it was never meant to be combined with? (- perhaps profit, power, or convenience?)
- 3. What does it mean that Jesus *is* the temple now? What might our approach to worship individually or together as a church say about our understanding of who God is and what he desires?
- 4. Why does Jesus not 'entrust' himself to them? Is *our* belief in Jesus superficial, incomplete, fearful—or a saving belief (even the size of a mustard seed!) that trusts and follows? (listen in to the end of the sermon if you've not had a chance)
