

Micah 2:1-5 - Imagining God

Micah condemns the covetousness of the wealthy. Why do their actions fall under judgement?

Can you think of other passages in the Old or New Testaments which highlight the dangers of wealth? You might consider Matthew 6:19-21 or 1 Timothy 6:6-10 - but there are lots of others!

How are we in danger of covetousness?

Verses 6-11

The people in Micah's day didn't want to hear this message. Why were they so confident that God wouldn't judge them?

How might we be in danger of distorting God's character to excuse our sins or make our lives easier? How can we help each other to avoid this?

Verses 12-13

Note that there is no logical link with the preceding verses. God acts out of grace alone.

How do these verses point to the Lord Jesus?

How does the portrait of salvation in these verses help us to understand our sin problem more deeply? How does the chapter's portrait of sin help us to appreciate God's salvation more?
