Questions for Homegroups

Psalm 126

- The psalmist recalls Israel's return from exile in Babylon (vv1-3) and yet cries out to God for the restoration of their fortunes (v4). Remind yourselves why the return from the exile was a disappointment and why the psalmist's situation is, in some ways, similar to the situation of Christians.
- The psalmist was joyful (vv1-2) and indeed is still joyful (v3). What are the most important things that should give Christians joy? What has your experience been like?
- What things make you cry out to God as the psalmist does in v4?
- In the midst of disappointment the psalmist is still willing to "sow with tears" (vv5-6). What might this look like for you?
- There is a promise of harvest in vv5-6. When can we expect that harvest? Do you have examples of this?
- What specifically should change in your life if you are to take Psalm 126 seriously?

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
