



## Hebrews 11:24-26 - Choosing the right thing even though it's the hard thing

- 1) Moses was raised in the Egyptian royal family. What privileges would he have enjoyed (see also Acts 7:20-22) as part of that?
- 2) Moses chose to give all that up to '*be ill-treated along with the people of God*'. Can you think of modern day equivalents of what Moses gave up 'for the sake of Christ'?
- 3) We're told in v25 that Moses chose to be ill treated...'*rather than to enjoy the fleeting pleasures of sin*'. How can the good things of this world become sinful things?
- 4) Do you feel the tug of the 'pleasures' and 'treasures' of this world? How can/do they hold us back from choosing to do the right thing as people of faith?
- 5) Moses lived around 1500 years before Jesus. How do you think he was able to '*consider disgrace for the sake of Christ as of greater value than the treasures of Egypt*'?
- 6) Verse 26 tells us that Moses was 'looking ahead to his reward'. What do you think that was?
- 7) How does what Jesus did for us (see 2 Corinthians 8:9) help us to choose to do the right thing even though it's the hard thing?

Are there particular things that are hard in this for you right now that you could be praying about together (you might also consider praying for Christians around the world who are ill-treated for their faith in Christ)?
