

## *Questions for Homegroups*

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### **1 Corinthians 8**

- Examine Paul's argument in 1 Corinthians 8:4-13. What are the steps he takes? Why might this have relevance to us who do not deal with food from pagan temples?
- Assuming for a moment that no one else was affected, does the universal sovereignty of God and Christ (vv4-6) mean that we would be entirely free to associate with false worship? (cf eg 1 Cor 10:14-22)
- What are the characteristics of a "weak" person? How are they to be distinguished from an awkward person, a false teacher or a petty legalist? How should we deal with these different kinds of people?
- How does Paul say that we should balance our freedom with our concern for the weak (v13)? Is this lifestyle sustainable?
- The root issue seems to be addressed in v1 - the tension between love and knowledge. What does a "knowledge person" look like? How can we be deeply committed to love?

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
