Why do you think that the idea of ‘home’ is so emotive?

The New Jerusalem is described using fantastic imagery, as is everything in Revelation. Look at all the details of its description and try to work out their significance?

What does this signify?

In what ways do think we might be expected as Christians to anticipate our final life in the life we live today?

What for you is the biggest obstacle to living a life which rejoices in your future hope?

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
