- What do you make of Leslie Newbigen's comment that "The best apologetic [argument for] of the Gospel is a church that believes it, lives it, and proclaims it."
- Have a look at John 17v22-24, 13v35. How does our understanding of the Trinity shape our identity and our family life. Why ought there be an inward attractional element to church life?
- "Because God loves he sends" do you think this is a true statement? Where do we see sending in John's gospel? Consider John 1v6, 3v16, 6v38, 11v42, 17v18 and 14v26. What does it mean that we are sent?
- How can we "do what we love and take Jesus with us"?
